
### Let's get descriptive!

How do you know Mr Ogg is a giant? Read chapter two again and find any descriptions that show you Mr Ogg is much bigger than Harvey and his Mum.

- Look for literal physical descriptions. Like: he has a big nose.
- Look for metaphorical descriptions. Like: his nose was as round as a bowling ball.
- Look for actions that paint a picture. Like: Mr Ogg used an entire table cloth to blow his nose.

# Next: imagine there's a giant in your classroom!

Describe what happens when the giant comes to visit, using lots of description!





# Chapter two Quick answers!

## Let's get descriptive!

Sometimes, we can use adjectives to simply describe what a character looks like.

#### **Physical descriptions:**

- Huge, hairy fists
- Big brown eyes

Sometimes, we can compare our character (or parts of our character) to other things.

#### Metaphorical descriptions that use a comparison:

- He had all the grace of a rhino squeezing through a cat flap
- A jumbo-sausage-roll-sized finger
- His hot breath hit me like a blast of Mum's hairdryer

And sometimes, actions are even better than adjectives. Here we can tell how big Mr Ogg is because simple movements are destroying Harvey's house!

#### **Physical actions:**

- The force of his breath blew me into the fridge door
- He stamped his foot again, smashing through a floorboard
- Mr Ogg flexed his own muscles, sending his clenched fists through the ceiling
- Mr Ogg clapped his hands, sending the last of our chairs flying
